The Urban is receiving another wonderful gift that is enabling us to rent a school bus on September 22 and arrange an all-day event to take many of our Indigenous attendees to a sweat lodge ceremony at the Sandy-Saulteaux Spiritual Centre in Beausejour. This ceremony will be followed there by a traditional feast and then the bus ride back to our parking lot. The Sandy-Saulteaux Spiritual Centre is a United Church Indigenous Seminary. We are very excited about this! The drive to Beausejour will be fun and an area of Manitoba that many have not visited before. Our board of directors will be learning more about the Indigenous cultural, traditional and spiritual customs as well.

The Urban is taking part in our second Ride for Refuge (a 5 km walk here in the city, or a 10, 25 or 50 km bike ride leaving from North Kildonan) on September 29, 2018. The pledges for the teams for the Urban are allocated to the Urban (minus the Blue Sea Philanthropy admin costs determined by the amount raised for the Urban). Last year these were our teams for the Urban: *Urban Epiphanies* (Epiphany Lutheran), *the Urban Team* (Urban board members), *Gloria Dei Lutheran Church*, *First Lutheran Church*, *Crosswalkers* (Church of the Cross) and *West End Riders*. It was a beautiful day and the event was really well organized!!

I'm really hoping to have 10 teams or more this year! Last September, the Ride for Refuge took place in cities across Canada raising money for 186 charities, of which 31 charities were in Manitoba, charities that provide refuge and hope for displaced, vulnerable and exploited people everywhere. The Urban is so happy to be a part of this event. The walk is approx. 1.5 hrs with lunch at the end of the route. The ride details are on the website. The route again begins at Covenant Christian Reformed Church, 653 Knowles Ave. in North Kildonan (totally organized by Blue Sea Philanthropy - police direction on route, insurance for walkers/bike riders, snacks, lunch, t-shirts, etc.).
